

Background: The dilemma



Information-cost ratio

- Need for evidence-based decision making
- Need for documented evidence 1
- Need for surveillance
- But: Resources
- Optimal use of resources needed...what is the risk of...?



How would you define risk?

 «Risk is usually defined as the chance of encountering some form of harm, loss or damage. For this reason it has two components: the chance, or probability, of something happening; and if it does happen, the consequences.»

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Codex Alimentarius Risk Assessment

Risk assessment:

- Hazard identification
- Hazard characterisation
- Exposure assessment
- Risk characterisation

Risk management:

- Risk evaluation
- Option assessment
- Monitoring and review


